

Composite

This map shows the composite ranking of tracts in theEmployment Opportunities dataset. Each category in the data set is classified by equal intervals and categorized with low, medium, or high rankings. The composite adds together all these rankings for each tract and is displayed with an equal interval distribution.

The dark areas on the map show Census tracts that have a high composite value. Meaning that these areas could indicate where residents might have lower opportunities for employment. This could include areas where there are less jobs within a 30 minute commute by bike, bus or walking; and it could include areas with lower number of jobs per tract. This composite does not indicate that all of these factors are present in a tract, but that more of them may be present.
