


Type of Commute: Carpool

This map shows how people age 16 and over commute to work. About 12% of the population carpool for their commute in the Metropolitan Planning Organization census tracts.

The full range of data for each map has been divided into thirds to create low, medium, and high percentage categories. A histogram is also included to show that the data is not necessarily distributed equally across these three categories. About 9% of the population that carpool are in the 3 tracts in the highest percentage category.



The chart below shows the number of tracts in the Metropolitan Planning Organization Area that have low, medium, and high categorizations type of commute.
